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### ntroduction

As the world has been moving away from nature, it is facing various lifestyle disorders like Diabetes, Hypertension etc. in spite of tremendous advancement in modern medical science. Ayurveda is a medical science which embraces nature as well as a philosophy of life. It is being recognized as a potential system of medicine all over the world. We find a holistic approach towards health and disease management in classical texts of Ayurveda. Several Ayurvedic texts have been translated into various languages of the world particularly in English & German. World Health Organisation (WHO) and World Health Assembly adopted resolution urging different countries to give adequate importance to the utilization of their respective traditional systems of medicine.

The importance of Ayurveda has undoubtedly increased in current scenario where conventional medicine, finds itself unable to fight many diseases. The medical research today is entangled in rapidly increasing struggle against microbes that develop resistance to nearly all drugs tried on them. The patients, not able to bear the side effects of conventional antibiotics are now turning towards alternative medical therapy esp. Ayurveda.

Central and State Governments in our country have implemented various schemes to develop and promote Ayurveda through medical care, education and research. Government of India has given shape to the recommendations of various committees regarding development of Indian System of Medicine (ISM) and established Central Council of Research in Indian Medicine and Homeopathy (CCRIM & H) in 1969. The Council has established major Institutes and projects for research in Ayurveda, Unani, Siddha and Homeopathy. Central Council for Research in Ayurveda and Siddha (CCRAS), one of the four



successor councils of CCRIM & H was established in 1978. This step further intensified research in Ayurveda and Siddha

Ayurvedic Research Institutes in India and abroad are in the process of substantiating the ancient wisdom of Ayurveda with the parameters of modern medical science also. Millions of dollars are being spent on studying the medicinal properties of plants like Neem Tulsi and Guggul etc Many groups in Germany, US, Britain and Japan are working to explore the hidden treasure of Ayurveda in its original form.

Currently department of Ayush under Health Ministry looks after development of Ayurvedic education all over India. Government of India also announced its plan to have seperate ministry to deal with affairs of Ayurvedic system of medicine.

The main reason for this revival of Ayurveda lies in its basic principles that have stood the test of time. These principles are based on holistic approach with particular attention towards life style, exercise, stress factors. Ayurveda essentially utilizes drugs in their natural form without disturbing their composition which minimizes chances of side effects.

A new health consciousness is sweeping the world with emphasis on staying healthy, building the immune system and using healing methods close to nature, a concept that has its roots in Ayurveda.

#### PLACEMENT FACILITIES:

College is providing placement facilities for passed out students by collaborating with linked private Hospitals Jiva, ayeva Nursing Centres, Pharmaceuticals, Patanjli Ayuravedic Centres & Pharma Industry, Kerala Ayurveda etc.

# Highlights

#### **AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS:**

The college has number of video-cassettes & slides for making learning easier and interesting in different subjects like Anatomy, Physiology and Pathology. Video Cassette Player, Colour T.V. and Projector-all these equipments are available in our institute.

#### PANCHAKARMA DEPARTMENT:

An Advanced branch of internal medicine in ayurveda, Panchakarma is equipped with all the instruments for panchakarma therapy. Chronic diseases like insomnia, depression, neurological disorders and joint pains are being treated in this department by trained doctors and therapist.

#### **DISSECTION HALL:**

Dissection is carried out in dissection hall on human cadavers. Further, models charts are also available for Practical training and specimens.

#### PHYSIOLOGY LABORATORY:

Institute has well equipped Physiology lab for conducting all the practicals related to physiology of human body as per CCIM/ university syllabus.

#### PATHOLOGY LABORATORY:

Institute has a Pathology lab which not only provides facilities for training of the students but also serves the attached hospital through all kinds of hematological, biochemical, urine, stool and sputum investigations. All the tests are performed with latest techniques.

#### **HERBAL GARDEN & MUSEUM:**

Institute has museum where samples of various dry herbal drugs, specimens have been displayed with their proper identification. Apart from this herbal garden has also been developed in the college campus for identification of medicinal plants. Nursery of medicinal plants has also been established

#### PHARMACY MUSEUM:

Institute has Pharmacy museum where various raw drugs of herbal, mineral and animal origin as well as their formulations have been exhibited. Students learn Ayurvedic Pharmaceutical procedures in this department for preparation of Ayurvedic classical drugs.

# TOXICOLOGY AND JURISPRUDENCE MUSEUM:

Institute has museum of toxicology. Various poisonous drugs and a number of models and charts concerning medical jurisprudence have been displayed in this museum.

#### SURGERY DEPARTMENT:

Training is given to students in this department regarding wound management, ksharsutra therapy, accidental injury, operative procedures etc. Kshara shutra operation, an Ayurvedic method of surgery is performed under the department of Shalya Tantra for piles, fistula cases. This process is better than the modern method of surgery, which is accepted by WHO.

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# A Glance of Panchkarma Therapy

Ayurveda is a rich store house of time tested and effective recipes for the treatment of several obstinate and chronic diseases. For the treatment of chronic ailment and for rejuvenation, our ancient scholars have mentioned one specialized therapy known as Panchakarma. If one opens any chapter on the treatment of diseases in any classical texts, the first point to grab his attention is always description of the panchakarma measure as a line treatment Panchakarama therapy primarily aims at cleansing the body, of its accumulated impurities and nourishing body tissues. Panchakarama helps to rejuvenate body tissues and further prevents the process of aging.

The term Panchakarma literally means five (Pancha) specialized therapies (Karma). The therapies which are included under this collective term are as:

I. Vamana Karma Medicated vomiting2. Virechana karma Medicated purgation

3. Niruha Basti Karma Drug is administered through medicated enema

containing decoction of herbs, among others.

4. Anuvasana Basti Drug is administered through medicated Karma enema containing medicated oil

5. Nasya Karma Drug administered through nose of the patient.

Prior to the Panchkarma the body of the patient is to be suitably prepared and for this purpose, two preparatory therapies are performed . These are  $\cdot$ 

- (A) External and internal application of medicated ghee or oil.
- (B) Medicated Steam Therapy.

The Panchkarma therapy are useful in many ways:

(I) Increase in Digestive Power (ii) Diseases are alleviated (iii) Restoration & Maintenance of body system (iv) Proper functioning of mind & intellect (v) Improvement of skin colour (vi) Increase strength (vii) Person becomes capable of getting good progeny (viii) Sexual power increases (ix) Aging process is delayed (x) The person enjoys disease-free, healthy life.

So, Panchakarma gives us two fold benefit, one is to relieve from diseases (both chronic & acute) which are almost incurable and second is to prevent the diseases by boosting immune system.

Currently this classical method of treatment is practised all over India and is also attracting scientists from all over the world. Our Institution is well equipped wih instruments for panchakarma therapy. Institute also provides physiotherapy instruments for the OPD and IPD patients, under the supervision of trained doctors and therapists. Students of this institution also take benefit of this method of treatment for their future practice.











**GURU NANAK AYURVEDIC PHARMACY** 

The special unit of "Nasha Niwaran" (i.e. Deaddiction of alcohol & opium etc.) is also running in the hospital under the direct guidance of Chairman Dr. Balwinder Singh Walia.

BDP Pharmacy which is functioning since 1990 is one of the prestigious Ayurvedic Pharmacy in North India. This pharmacy is also attached with the college for demonstration of drug preparation to the students. Apart from this, Department of the Rasa-shatra, also has its own pharmacy with ultra modern machines along with ancient tools for imparting practical training to the students under the guidance of subject's teachers as per syllabus.

There is a separate research section being run for Ayurvedic medicine preparation. The effect of Ayurvedic drugs are observed in various diseases especially those in which modern medical science has its limitations.

# Guru Nanak Charitable Hospital



The hospital with the following 8 clinical department is being looked after by different specialists:

- 2. Dept. of Panchkarma
- 3. Dept. of Shalya Tantra (Surgery)
- 4. Dept. of Kumar Bhritya (Neonatology & Pediatrics)
- 5. Dept. of Stri Roga & Prasuti Tantra (Gynecology & Obstetrics)
- 6. Dept. of Shalakya Tantra (Opthamology & Oto-Rhino-Laryngology)
- 7. Atyayik (Casualty)
- 8. Swastha Rakshan (Preventive Medicine)

The Hospital is equipped with modern diagnostic techniques. There is a separate section of drugless therapies like Naturopathy, Yoga, Acupuncture & Acupressure etc.

The students will be awarded the degree of Ayurvedacharya, Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine & Surgery (BAMS) by GURU RAVIDAS AYURVEDA UNIVERSITY HOSHIARPUR on completion of prescribed course.

#### **DURATION OF COURSE:**

The total duration of course is 5 years 6 moths, as follows:

First Year	1st - 1 year
Second Year	2nd - 1 year
Third Year	3rd - 1 year
Fourth Year	4th - 1 year 6 month
Compulsory Rotatory Internship	- 1 year

NOTE: Degree will be awarded only after completing the satisfactory rotatory internship as per university rules and regulations.

#### FIRSTYEAR EXAMINATION:

- i) The First year examination will be held at the end of one academic year of First year session. The session ordinarily starts in July (Prior to university exams, house examination are conducted by the college in the month of March /April )
- ii) The first year examination will be held in the following subjects:
  - I. Padarth Vigyan Avam Ayurved Itihas (Philosophy & History)
- 2. Sanskrit

3. Kriya Sharir (Physiology)

- 4. Rachna Sharir (Anatomy)
- 5. Maulik Siddhant avam Ashtang Hridaya (Basic Principles of Ayurveda)
- iii) A student failed not in more than two subjects will be held eligible to keep the terms for the second year Course. However he/she will not be allowed to appear for second year examination unless he/she passes in all the subjects of the first year

#### SECOND YEAR EXAMINATION:

- I) The Second year sessions will start every year in the month of July following completion of First year examination. The second year examination will be ordinarily held by the end of month of May/June every year after completion of 1st year session (Prior to university exams, house examination are conducted by the college in the month of March/April)
- ii) The Second year examination will be held in the following subjects:
  - I. Dravyaguna Vigyan (Pharmacology)
  - 2. Rasashastra- Bhaishajya Kalpana (Pharmaceutical Science)
  - 3. Agad Tantra Vyavhar Ayurved Evam Vidhi Vaidyaka (Toxicology and Medical Jurisprudence)
  - 4. Charak-Purvardh (Basic Principles of Ayurveda)
- iii) A student failed in not more than two subjects will be held eligible to keep the terms for the third year examination, however he/she will not be allowed to appear for third year examination unless he/she passes in all the subjects of second year examination



#### THIRD YEAR EXAMINATION:

- i) The Third year session will start every year in the month of July following completion of second year Examination. The Third year examination will be ordinarily held and completed by the end of the month of May/ June every year after completion of one year of third year session (Prior to university exams, house examination are conducted by the college in the month of March /April)
- ii) The Third year examination will be held in the following subjects:-
  - I. Roga NidanVikriti Vigyan (Pathology & Microbiology)
  - 2. Charak Samhita-Uttarardh (Basic Principles of Ayurveda)
  - 3. SwasthaVRITTA & Yoga (Preventive and Social Medicine & Yoga)
  - 4. Parsuti & Striroga (Gynaecology & Obstetrics)
  - 5. Bal Roga (Paediatrics)
- iii) A Student failed in not more than two subjects will be held eligible to keep the terms for the 4th year examination. However he/ she will not be allowed to appear for final year examination unless he/she passes in all subjects of Third year examination

#### FOURTH YEAR EXAMINATION:

- i) The final year session will be of I year and 6 months (18 months) duration and will start every year in the month of July following completion of Third year Examination. The 4th year examination will be ordinarily held by the end of month of Oct/Nov every year after completion of one and half year of final year session (Prior to university exams, house examination are conducted by the college in the month of March/April)
- ii) 4th year examination will comprise the following subjects:
  - 1. Shalya Tantra (General Surgery)
  - 2. Shalakya Tantra (Diseases of Ear, Nose & Throat, Ophthalmology)
  - 3. Kayachikitsa (Internal Medicine including Psychiatry, Rasayana & Vaji Karma)
  - 4. Panch karma
  - 5. Reserch Methodology & Medical statistics

#### COMPULSORY INTERNSHIP (Duration of Intership: 1 Year):

The student will join the compulsory internship programme after passing the final professional examination. The internship programme will start after the declaration of the result of final professional examination. The period of the Internship will be of one year. Internship programme and time distribution will be as follows:

- 1. The interns will receive an orientation regarding programme detail of Internship programme along with the rules and regulation, In an orientation workshop which will be organized during the first three days of the beginning of Internship programme. A workbook will be given to each intern. The Intern will enter date wise details of activities undertaken by him/her during his/her training.
- 2. Every intern will provisionally register himself with the concerned state Board/Council and obtain a certificate to this effect before joining the Internship program.
- 3. Daily working hours of intern will be not less than eight hours.
- 4. Generally one year internship programme is divided into clinical training of six months in the Ayurvedic

Hospital attached to the college and six months in PHC/ CHC/ Rural Hospital/ District Hospital/ Civil Hospital or any Govt. Hospital of modern medicine. But where there is no provision/permission of the state government for allowing the graduate of Ayurveda in the hospital/dispensary of modern medicine, the one year Internship will be completed in the hospital attached to the college.

- B. Six months training of interns will be carried out with an object to orient and acquaint the intern with National Health programme. The Intern will have to join in one of the following institutes for undertaking such training.
  - (a) Primary Health Centre
- (b) Community Health Centre / District Hospital
- (c) Any hospital of modern medicine (d) Any Ayurveda hospital or Dispensary

All the above centres (a,b,c and d) will have to be recognized by the concerned University and concerned Government designated authority for taking such a training.
